

FIRST READING: Acts 10:34-48

Peter spoke to Cornelius of the good news, telling him the story of Jesus beginning with John the Baptist and then all that the apostles had seen and witnessed while following Jesus. Peter then announced that God's invitation to believe and follow was meant for all people. His impassioned preaching led many to faith.

³⁴Peter opened his mouth and said: "Truly I understand that God shows no partiality, ³⁵but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. ³⁶As for the word that he sent to Israel, preaching good news of peace through Jesus Christ (he is Lord of all), ³⁷you yourselves know what happened throughout all Judea, beginning from Galilee after the baptism that John proclaimed: 38 how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power. He went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. ³⁹And we are witnesses of all that he did both in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree, 40 but God raised him on the third day and made him to appear, 41 not to all the people but to us who had been chosen by God as witnesses, who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. ⁴²And he commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one appointed by God to be judge of the living and the dead. ⁴³To him all the prophets bear witness that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name." 44While Peter was still saying these things, the Holy Spirit fell on all who heard the word. ⁴⁵And the believers from among the circumcised who had come with Peter were amazed, because the gift of the Holy Spirit was poured out even on the Gentiles. ⁴⁶For they were hearing them speaking in tongues and extolling God.

Then Peter declared, ⁴⁷"Can anyone withhold water for baptizing these people, who have received the Holy Spirit just as we have?" 48And he commanded them to be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. Then they asked him to remain for some days.

SECOND READING: 1 John 5:1-8

John brings the message of love back to the commandments. The way by which we will love our neighbors, the children of God, is by keeping the commandments that God has given us. Yet again, John portrays love as a concrete way of life rather than empty words. For those who are in Christ, keeping God's commandments is not burdensome, but rather a joyous response to God's gift of eternal life.

¹Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God, and everyone who loves the Father loves whoever has been born of him. ²By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. ³For this is the love of God, that we keep his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome. ⁴For everyone who has been born of God overcomes the world. And this is the victory that has overcome the world — our faith. ⁵Who is it that overcomes the world except the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God? ⁶This is he who came by water and blood — Jesus Christ; not by the water only but by the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one who testifies, because the Spirit is the truth. ⁷For there are three that testify: ⁸the Spirit and the water and the blood; and these three agree.

HOLY GOSPEL: John 15:9-17

Jesus called his followers to live a life grounded in love by abiding in his love. He declared that one would remain in his love by keeping his commandment. The commandment was both simple and complex: Love one another as Christ has loved us. Calling his followers "friends" now that they know his mission, Jesus repeated his command succinctly. Love one another.

longer do I call you servants, for the servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all that I have heard from my Father I have made known to you. ¹⁶You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit and that your fruit should abide, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name, he may give it to you. ¹⁷These things I command you, so that you will love one another."



AFFIRMATION OF BAPTISM

P Brothers and sisters in Christ: In Holy Baptism our Lord Jesus Christ received you and made you members of his Church. In the community of God's people, you have learned from his Word God's loving purpose for you and all creation. You have been called to be witnesses to the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

Now, therefore, I ask you, together with this congregation, to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the Church, the faith in which we baptize.

- P Do you renounce all the forces of evil, the devil, and all his empty promises?
- C I do.
- P Do you believe in God the Father?
- C I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.
- P Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?
- C I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell.*
 On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.
- P Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?
- C I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen
- P You have made public profession of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in Holy Baptism: to live among God's faithful people, to hear his Word and share in his supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of our Lord Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

- R I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.
- P Let us pray.

Gracious Lord, through water and the Spirit you have made these persons. You forgave them all their sins and brought them to newness of life. Continue to strengthen them with the Holy Spirit, and daily increase in them your gifts of grace: the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence; through Jesus Christ, your Son, and our Lord.

- C Amen.
- C We welcome you as members of Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church to join with us in worshiping God, hearing his Word and sharing his supper, proclaiming the good news of God in Christ through word and deed, loving and serving our neighbors in need.


THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

P Holy God, mighty Lord, gracious Father: Endless is your mercy and eternal your reign. You have filled all creation with light and life; heaven and earth are full of your glory. Through Abraham you promised to bless all nations. You rescued Israel, your chosen people. Through the prophets you renewed your promise; and, at this end of all the ages, you sent your Son, who in words and deeds proclaimed your kingdom and was obedient to your will, even to giving his life.

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me. For as often as we eat of this bread and drink from this cup we proclaim the Lord's death until he comes.

- C Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.
- P Therefore, gracious Father, with this bread and cup we remember the life our Lord offered for us. And, believing the witness of his resurrection, we await his coming in power to share with us the great and promised feast.
- C Amen. Come, Lord Jesus.
- P Send now, we pray, your Holy Spirit, the spirit of our Lord and of his resurrection, that we who receive the Lord's body and blood may live to the praise of your glory and receive our inheritance with all your saints in light.
- C Amen. Come, Holy Spirit.
- P Join our prayers with those of your servants of every time and every place, and unite them with the ceaseless petitions of our great high priest until he comes as victorious Lord of all.

Grape juice is available in the center of the communion tray.


After you have received, please place the empty communion glass in the basket provided







MUSIC NOTES

"Rock of Ages, Cleft for Me" - arr. Peter Pindar Stearns

This hymn by Augustus M. Toplady (1740-1778) is about sin and salvation, about our helpless need, and about the all-sufficiency of Christ's atonement. The metaphor of the Rock of Ages is found variously in Isaiah 26:4, Exodus 33:22, and 1 Corinthians 10:4. A single four-line stanza of the hymn text first appeared in the *Gospel Magazine* published by Toplady in 1775. It came at

the end of an article titled "Life – a Journey," a message of hope of all who had fallen into sin. The complete poem appeared in the same magazine in March 1776 with the heading "A living and dying Prayer for the Holiest Believer in the World."

"Lord, Whose Love in Humble Service" – arr. Janet Linker

Albert F. Bayly (1901-1984) wrote this poem in response to an invitation by the Hymn Society of America to submit hymns on social welfare. It was named "Conference Hymn" for the second National Conference on the Churches and Social Welfare held in Cleveland, Ohio, October 23-27, 1961. The Hymn Society Published it in *Seven New Social Welfare Hymns* (1961). It first appeared in a major volume in *Methodist Hymnal* (1964).

"Oriental" - Enrique Granados

Enrique Granados (1867-1916) was a Spanish composer and pianist. He studied piano and composition at the Barcelona Conservatory then continued his compositional studies in Paris. He made his recital debut in Barcelona in 1890 and first supported himself by playing piano in restaurants and giving private concerts. He first attracted attention as a composer with his opera *María del Carmen*, but his greatest masterpiece was a series of pieces entitled *Goyescas*, inspired by the paintings and etchings of Franciso Goya. He tragically lost his life at sea in 1916 – the victim of the sinking by a German submarine of the S.S. Sussex in the English Channel on a return trip from New York.

"Lord, Make Me an Instrument of Your Peace" - arr. Victor C. Johnson

This arrangement is based on an anonymous text that is usually called the "Prayer of Saint Francis," a widely known Christian prayer for peace. It is often associated with the Italian Saint Francis of Assisi (c. 1182-1226), but the prayer in its present form has not been traced back further than 1912 when it first appeared in French in a small spiritual magazine called *La Clochette* (The Little Bell), published by a Catholic organization in Paris named *La Ligue de la Sainte-Messe* (The League of the Holy Mass.)

"What a Friend We Have in Jesus" - arr. John Purifoy

Joseph M. Scriven (1819-1886) wrote these words circa 1855 to comfort his mother in a time of sorrow, never intending them to have any wider use. A friend saw the manuscript when sitting with Scriven during the author's last illness. Scriven admitted "The Lord and I wrote it between us." The hymn evidently appeared first (and anonymously) in Horace L. Hastings's Social Hymns. Original and Selected (1865).

"Abide with Me" – arr. John Purifoy

Henry Francis Lyte (1793-1847) wrote this hymn in 1847 as he was about to leave his pastorate at Lower Brixham and take a trip to Southern France in an unsuccessful effort to regain his health. The opening words were inspired by Luke 24:29, "Abide with us: for it is toward evening and the day is far spent." The poem appeared in a leaflet in 1847 and then in the *Remains of Henry Francis Lyte* (1850).

"Postlude on Truro" - arr. Michael Bedford

Brian Wren (b. 1936) wrote this hymn in April 1968 for Easter after the assassination of Martin Luther King Jr. He "tried to express an Easter hope out of that terrible event," rather than Easter as "long ago, far away, and high above." The tune TRURO gets its name for a city in Cornwall, England.
