ANNUAL MEETING ANNOUNCEMENT

The annual meeting of the congregation will take place TODAY at 12:30 pm, following the second service. The agenda will include election of 4 members to the council, a vote to ratify 3 amendments to the NALC constitution and a vote to approve the 2026 budget. Information about the proposed amendments to the NALC constitution can be found on the NALC website: <https://thenalc.org/en-us/about/constitution/constitutional-ratifications-2025-2026/> A brief overview is provided below:

The North American Lutheran Church (NALC) Executive Council, Bishop, and General Secretary are seeking the ratification of three constitutional amendments approved at the 2025 Mission Convocation in Pittsburgh, PA. All NALC congregations are asked to hold congregational meetings to vote “yes” or “no” on these amendments by February 8, 2026. Grace will vote on the amendments at the annual meeting of the congregation on Sunday, November 16. At least 50% of NALC congregations must vote. A simple majority at the local level approves the congregation’s vote. Two-thirds of all voting congregations must vote “yes” for ratification to pass. Deadline for submission: February 8, 2026. Summary of the Three Amendments:

Amendment One: Administrative clean-up—moves certain constitutional language to the Bylaws and corrects Scrivener’s errors.

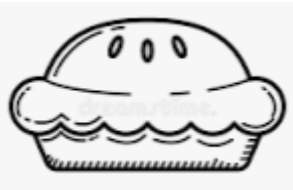
Amendment Two: Establishes a new article on the North American Lutheran Seminary (NALS), defining its mission to form pastors and church leaders, its governance through a Board of Regents, and its integration with partner seminaries.

Amendment Three: Expands Article 16, renaming it 'Legal and Financial Matters,' to clarify NALC fiscal year, financial oversight, fund handling, and official authorizations.

What did Martin Luther say about Prayer? By Donna Dettmann



First - Luther teaches prayer is a duty and a privilege. He believes praying was a direct command from God.

Second – Prayer is a constant spiritual battle, requiring immense effort.

Third – He developed a method for using scripture: "A Simple Way to Pray" uses the Lord's Prayer to understand how and why to pray without ceasing. (written in 1535).

Fourth – He advised against delaying prayer for any reason. Luther saw this practice as a "deceptive idea" from the devil.

Luther also taught that God hears prayers and is incredibly generous, often giving more that we ask for or understand and that the Holy Spirit's role is to intercedes on your behalf. (Romans 8:26)



Discuss in your home, small group, or use for personal reflections:

- When was a time you were afraid? Explain.
- How can faith in Jesus get you through tough times?

DEVOTIONS



Read: Luke 21:5-19.

This reading in Luke uses apocalyptic language, meaning it has a focus on the end times and worldwide struggles. Jesus tells his followers not to guess when the end times will come. Disasters and tragedies have happened and continue to happen around the world. When such times come and people experience major crises in their lives, it is good to know that *“not a hair of your head will perish”* (v. 18). For those who witness to their faith during times of crisis, it is also helpful to know that Jesus will provide the words and the wisdom. While we may anticipate difficult times, we are not to be led astray and worship that which is not eternal, even a beautiful temple like the one in Jerusalem. We are not to speculate about when the end will come or to follow false saviors. Life can be scary and difficult. We need to hold on to Jesus and his promise to hold on to us to the end.

Discuss: What are some disasters or tragedies happening in today’s world? How can faith in Jesus help us endure such times?

Pray: **Almighty God, when wars, earthquakes, and other scary things happen, help us to lean on you alone and trust your eternal care through Jesus Christ our Savior. Amen.**
