SECOND READING: 1 John 1:1-2:2

The first letter of John opens with eloquent descriptions of Jesus as the light and life of the world which the author prays that the readers will experience. The passage concludes with an exhortation to live in truth and light by confessing our sins and receiving the mercy and grace of God through Jesus.

¹That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we looked upon and have touched with our hands, concerning the word of life — ²the life was made manifest, and we have seen it, and testify to it and proclaim to you the eternal life, which was with the Father and was made manifest to us — ³that which we have seen and heard we proclaim also to you, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ. ⁴And we are writing these things so that our joy may be complete. ⁵This is the message we have heard from him and proclaim to you, that God is light, and in him is no darkness at all. ⁵If we say we have fellowship with him while we walk in darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth. ⁵But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have

fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin. ⁸If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. ⁹If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. ¹⁰If we say we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us.

¹My little children, I am writing these things to you so that you may not sin. But if anyone does sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous. ²He is the propitiation for our sins, and not for ours only but also for the sins of the whole world.

ALLELUIA VERSE (John 6:68)



HOLY GOSPEL: John 20:19-31

Jesus appeared to the disciples on the evening of his resurrection offering them his peace, forgiveness, and the presence of the Holy Spirit. Thomas, who was not present, had difficulty believing when the others told him of their encounter. Jesus appeared again with Thomas present and Thomas confessed him as Lord. The risen Christ promised blessing to those who believe without having seen.

¹⁹On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being locked where the disciples were for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." ²⁰When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. ²¹Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I am sending you." ²²And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. ²³If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you withhold forgiveness from any, it is withheld." ²⁴Now Thomas, one of the twelve, called the Twin, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to

them, "Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe." ²⁶Eight days later, his disciples were inside again, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were locked, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." ²⁷Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here, and see my hands; and put out your hand, and place it in my side. Do not disbelieve, but believe." ²⁸Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" ²⁹Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed." ³⁰Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; ³¹but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name.

THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

P Holy God, mighty Lord, gracious Father: Endless is your mercy and eternal your reign. You have filled all creation with light and life; heaven and earth are full of your glory. Through Abraham you promised to bless all nations. You rescued Israel, your chosen people. Through the prophets you renewed your promise; and, at this end of all the ages, you sent your Son, who in words and deeds proclaimed your kingdom and was obedient to your will, even to giving his life.

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. - P Send now, we pray, your Holy Spirit, the spirit of our Lord and of his resurrection, that we who receive the Lord's body and blood may live to the praise of your glory and receive our inheritance with all your saints in light.
- C Amen. Come, Holy Spirit.

Grape juice is available in the center of the communion tray.


After you have received, please place the empty communion glass in the basket provided



MUSIC NOTES

"Dance on Come, You Faithful, Raise the Strain" - arr. Mary Beth Bennett

This Greek Easter hymn by one of the most important of the early Greek hymnists, John of Damascus (c. 675-c. 749), includes references to the Song of Moses (Exodus 15) where deliverance through the Red Sea is related to deliverance by Christ from death. The hymn also uses Spring (the Queen of Seasons) as an allegory of the resurrection.

"Vignette on O Filii et Filae" - arr. Rebecca Groom Te Velde

"L'aleluya du jour de Pasques" (The Easter Alleluia) was written in Latin by Jean Tisserand, a Franciscan monk who died in 1494 in Paris. It was first discovered in a small untitled book printed sometime between 1518 and 1536. After an opening call to praise, the text reminds us of the women coming to the tomb, the angels' message to them, Christ appearing to the disciples at the evening, and even the story of doubting Thomas.

"The Day of Resurrection" - arr. Douglas E. Wagner

This hymn is a translation of Ode I in the Golden Canon of Easter by John of Damascus (ca. 657 -ca. 749)— a Greek hymn from before the 8th century. It is sung in Greek churches at midnight before Easter as the congregation lights candles to dispel darkness, and the silence is shattered by sounds of drums and trumpets. The hymn moves from the Exodus to the New Testament story of Easter morning, ending with a call to all to be joyful and to rejoice.

"The Strife if O'er" and "Thine Be the Glory" - arr. Frances Callahan

This selection for bell choir is an arrangement of two Easter hymns:

"The Strife is O'er" – The Latin antecedent of this hymn has been traced to the *Symphonia Sirenum Selectarum* (Cologne, 1695), where it appears anonymously. In the original version, two "Alleluias" begin each stanza. Francis Pott (1832-1909) translated it about 1859 and published it in his *Hymns Fitted to the Order of Common Prayer* (1861). The music is an adaptation of the opening phrases of "Gloria Patri et Filio" from Palestrina's *Magnificat Tertii Toni* (1591). William H. Monk arranged it for the original musical edition of *Hymns Ancient and Modern* (1861). The title comes from the second phrase, stanza one of the English text. "Thine Be the Glory" – (see notes for "Voluntary on *Thine Be the Glory*")

"We Walk By Faith" - arr. Valerie A. Floeter

Henry Alford (1810-1871) included this hymn in his *Psalms and Hymns* (London, 1844) and his *Year of Praise* (London, 1867). He wrote it for the commemoration of St. Thomas the Apostle. Not surprisingly it begins with 2 Corinthians 5:7 ("We walk by faith, not by sight") and then quotes from the account of Jesus and Thomas – about our Emmaus walk (Luke 24:13-35) and our meeting with the resurrected Lord in water, word, bread, and wine.

"Voluntary on Thine Be the Glory" - arr. Matthew H. Corl

The French hymn, "A toi la gloire" (dated 1884) by Edmond Budry (1854-1932), pastor in Vevey, Switzerland, was first published in the Y.M.C.A. Hymn Book (Lausanne, 1904). It was translated into English by Richard B. Hoyle (1875-1939) in 1923 and appeared in Cantate Domino (1925), the hymnal of the World's Student Christian Federation. In England, the first line is sung "Thine be the glory." The hymn tune is adapted from a chorus in the original version of Handel's oratorio Joshua (1748). The music was transferred from Joshua to Judas Maccabeus in 1751 and there it has remained, set to the words "See, the conquering hero comes."


