The Liturgy of the Word

FIRST READING: Jonah 3:1-5, 10

Jonah was commanded by God for a second time to go to the city of Nineveh and call the Ninevites to repentance. His message to them was that in forty days' time, the Lord would overthrow their city unless they turned from their evil ways. To Jonah's surprise, the Ninevites responded by fasting and putting on sackcloth and ashes.

¹Then the word of the LORD came to Jonah the second time, saying, ² "Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and call out against it the message that I tell you." ³ So Jonah arose and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the LORD. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly great city, three days' journey in breadth. ⁴ Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's journey. And he called out, "Yet forty days, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!" ⁵ And the people of Nineveh believed God. They called for a fast and put on sackcloth, from the greatest of them to the least of them. ¹⁰ When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil way, God relented of the disaster that he had said he would do to them, and he did not do it.

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 7:29-35

St. Paul instructed the Corinthian Christians that the world as they knew it was passing

away and the time of the Lord's return was very short. In order to be free to respond to the call of Christ, if one could be free of anxieties caused by family responsibilities, it was wise not to take them on. Paul was not anti-marriage or anti-family. He was simply being realistic about the cost of discipleship.

²⁹ This is what I mean, brothers: the appointed time has grown very short. From now on, let those who have wives live as though they had none, ³⁰ and those who mourn as though they were not mourning, and those who rejoice as though they were not rejoicing, and those who buy as though they had no goods, ³¹ and those who deal with the world as though they had no dealings with it. For the present form of this world is passing away.

³² I want you to be free from anxieties. The unmarried man is anxious about the things of the Lord, how to please the Lord. ³³ But the married man is anxious about worldly things, how to please his wife, ³⁴ and his interests are divided. And the unmarried or betrothed woman is anxious about the things of the Lord, how to be holy in body and spirit. But the married woman is anxious about worldly things, how to please her husband. ³⁵ I say this for your own benefit, not to lay any restraint upon you, but to promote good order and to secure your undivided devotion to the Lord.

Private prayer before receiving Holy Communion:







MUSIC NOTES

"We All Are One in Mission" - arr. Robert A. Hobby

Rusty Edwards (b. 1955) wrote this hymn in 1985 in response to a letter from the Lutheran bishop Paul Erickson that said, "Our mission is to touch the lives of others, with Christ's love." It was used in the 1986 mission appeal of the Lutheran Church in America, published in The Lutheran Journal (1986), and then entered The Presbyterian Hymnal (1990). It came to the current hymnal, Evangelical Lutheran Worship, through With One Voice in 1995.

"O Christ, Our True and Only Light" - arr. Paul Manz

This hymn was published in the *Devoti musica cordis* (Leipzig, 1630) of Johann Heermann (1585-1647) in a section of "pious Christian songs of lament for times of persecution and hardship." Written in the midst of the Thirty Years' War, the song directs the singer away from destruction, devastation, and disruption of peaceful daily life to the realm of faith and hope in the Savior, Jesus Christ. While rulers of Reformation and Counter-Reformation territories were aligning themselves into groups that sent armed forces to protect or gain advantage, Heermann looks beyond all this to the spiritual battle under Christ. Heermann's hymn is modeled on a prayer by the Jesuit Petrus Michaelis (Peter Michael Brillmacher, 1542-1595) for unbelievers and those who have gone astray.

"Medley of Epiphany Hymns" - arr. Larry Seifert

This medley is an arrangement of two Epiphany hymns:

"Brightest and Best of the Stars of the Morning" - Reginald Heber's (1783-1826) interest in the church led him to write a series of hymns for the Christian year, this being designated

"Epiphany" and meant to be sung between the creed and sermon. While it uses natural imagery, its concern is to make clear what is acceptable worship to God as stated in Psalm 51:17: "The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit: a broken and a contrite heart, O God, Thou will not despise."

"I Want to Walk as a Child of the Light" – The author of this hymn, Kathleen Thomerson (b. 1934) regards this hymn as a scriptural meditation and prayer, stimulated by a host of biblical verses mostly related to light, among them these: God gave the dome of the sky (Genesis 1:17); the Lord will be your light (Isaiah 60:19); the night is as bright as day (Psalm 139:12); once you were darkness, but now live as children of light (Ephesians 5:8 -9); God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts crying "Abba" (Galatians 4:6); the Son is the reflection of God's glory (Hebrews 1:3); you are children of light, so encourage one another (1 Thessalonians 5:5); be attentive to the prophetic message as a lamp shining in a dark place (2 Peter 1:19); whoever says "I abide in him" ought to walk as he walked (1 John 1:5-7); and the city has no sun or moon, for the glory of God is its light and its lamp the Lamb (Revelation 21:23).

"Lift Your Light" - arr. Mary McDonald

This soulful, gospel-style piece by Mary McDonald starts out subdued but then builds gradually to a powerful, spirited conclusion: "Lift your light higher and higher!...Jesus is the light of the world." There is also a brief statement of "This Little Light of Mine".

"O Morning Star, How Fair and Bright!" - arr. Mark Sedio

This Epiphany hymn came to be known as the "Queen of Chorales" and its partner "Wake, awake, for night is flying" as the "King of Chorales". Both hymns and their tunes are by Philipp Nicolai (1556-1608). "O Morning Star" is based on Psalm 45, with allusions to the jewel, jasper, and pearls of Revelation 21:11, 19 and 21, and the Alpha, Omega, and Morning Star of Revelation 22:13 and 16. The hymn's images pull together God's love in Christ through words and sacraments in a joyful song.


