

God spoke to Job from the whirlwind and challenged him to think clearly about his position in their relationship. Though Job was angry with God for allowing him to suffer so greatly, God alone is his Redeemer. The Lord peppered Job with rhetorical questions about his whereabouts when the universe was set into place.

SECOND READING: 2 Corinthians 6:1-13

Paul counseled the Corinthian Christians not to allow any of their actions to be a stumbling block for others as they worked to spread the good news of Christ. God's grace is not to be taken in vain, rather it is to be cherished as our greatest treasure.

¹As we work together with him, we urge you also not to accept the grace of God in vain. ²For he says,

“At an acceptable time I have listened to you,
and on a day of salvation I have helped you.”

See, now is the acceptable time; see, now is the day of salvation! ³We are putting no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, ⁴but as servants of God we have commended ourselves in every way: through great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, ⁵beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; ⁶by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, holiness of spirit, genuine love, ⁷truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; ⁸in honor and dishonor, in ill repute and good repute. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; ⁹as unknown, and yet are well known; as dying, and see—we are alive; as punished, and yet not killed; ¹⁰as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, and yet possessing everything.

¹¹We have spoken frankly to you Corinthians; our heart is wide open to you. ¹²There is no restriction in our affections, but only in yours. ¹³In return—I speak as to children—open wide your hearts also.





Wall Build for Westerville Habitat Partnership:

Westerville Habitat Partnership is hoping to have a wall build in August at the Point at Otterbein. The lumber cost for the 2019 build was \$2500, last year it was \$5500. We were not able to have the Wall Build last year, but we did purchase the lumber for the scheduled home. This year the estimated cost is \$12,000. Because of Covid restrictions our usual fund raisers have not been possible.



Please consider making a donation for this year's wall build. The person who will be purchasing the home from the August wall build is a single Westerville father. The family will be moving to Delaware where the house will be constructed. Also consider forming a Team to participate in the build on August 21.

Donations can be made at church, on line through the church or at the WHP website. Be sure to mark the funds WALL BUILD.

What is a Wall Build? A wall build is a one day event when groups of people get together to construct all the walls for a Habitat Home. It is like they are making a prefab house. The

finished walls are trucked to the home site and the regular Habitat volunteers and home purchaser then finish the construction over the next couple of months.
