Ash Wednesday Liturgy of The Word

EXHORTATION

P Brothers and sisters: God created us to experience joy in communion with him, to love all humanity, and to live in harmony with all of his creation. But sin separates us from God, our neighbors, and creation, and so we do not enjoy the life our Creator intended for us. Also, by our sin we grieve our Father, who does not desire us to come under his judgment, but to turn to him and live. As disciples of the Lord Jesus we are called to struggle against everything that leads us away from love of God and neighbor. Repentance, fasting, prayer, and works of love—the discipline of Lent—help us to wage our spiritual warfare. I invite you, therefore, to commit yourselves to this struggle and confess your sins, asking our Father for strength to persevere in your Lenten discipline.

Silence for reflection and self-examination.

CONFESSION

- P Most holy and merciful Father:

- C we confess to you, Lord.
- P Accept our repentance, Lord, for the wrongs we have done. For our blindness to human need and suffering, and our indifference to injustice and cruelty,
- C accept our repentance, Lord.
- P For all false judgments, for uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbors, and for our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us.
- C accept our repentance, Lord.
- P For our waste and pollution of your creation, and our lack of concern for those who come after us,
- C accept our repentance, Lord.
- P Restore us, good Lord, and let your anger depart from us.
- C Hear us, Lord, for your mercy is great. Amen

Those who desire to receive ashes come forward. The ministers apply ashes to the forehead of each person with the words:

Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.

After all who desire ashes have received them, the presiding minister leads the congregation in the conclusion of the confession.

FIRST READING: Joel 2:12-19

SECOND READING: 2 Corinthians 5:20b — 6:10

Paul explained to the believers in Corinth that as Christ followers, they were called to be ambassadors for Christ, representing him wherever they went and working for reconciliation among all people. This would require great endurance and strength, and yet through it all, God would guide them in their kingdom work.

"In a favorable time I listened to you,

and in a day of salvation I have helped you."

Behold, now is the favorable time; behold, now is the day of salvation. ³ We put no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry, ⁴ but as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: by great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, ⁵ beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; ⁶ by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, the Holy Spirit, genuine love; ⁷ by truthful speech, and the power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; ⁸ through honor and dishonor, through slander and praise. We are treated as impostors, and yet are true; ⁹ as unknown, and yet well known; as dying, and behold, we live; as punished, and yet not killed; ¹⁰ as sorrowful, yet always rejoicing; as poor, yet making many rich; as having nothing, yet possessing everything.

HOLY GOSPEL: Matthew 6:1-21

Jesus instructed his disciples in the ways in which they practiced prayer and generosity. They were not to broadcast it around town; instead, they were to keep it quiet so that their reward came from God and not from any person's praise.
