#### What is Advent?

The church divides the year into different seasons that emphasize the life of Christ and the life of the church. Beginning on Sunday, December 3, 2023, we will enter the season of the church year called Advent. Advent is the season of preparation and anticipation leading up to Christmas, and continuing to Epiphany January 6, 2024.

The focus of Advent is two-fold. On the one hand, we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, who came into the world as both God and Man so that our sins might be forgiven. On the other hand, we anticipate the day when Jesus will return to Earth and bring an end to this world. Those will be scary days, but we can look forward to the end of the world with hope because through faith in Jesus, the end of this world will mean the beginning of a new life with Christ for eternity.

Advent, then, is a time for us to repent and believe. Knowing that Jesus was born to forgive our sins, we repent (admit our failures to God) and believe that we are forgiven because of the death and resurrection of Jesus on our behalf. Also, knowing that Jesus is coming back, we repent and believe that when He returns, He will give us eternal life.

Dear friends in Christ,

As I complete my NALC commitments the first Sunday in Advent, Susan and I are more than ready to be present with you at Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church in Westerville! As Jim Caldwell mentioned in an earlier communication, it seems altogether right and proper to formally begin our relationship as pastor and people near the beginning of the church year—Advent and Christmas!

As much as I cherish Christmas, I also love Advent and especially the wonderful Advent hymns that call to mind the many ways that Christ comes—in the past at Bethlehem, in the present in Word and Sacrament, and in the future as King of kings and Lord of lords. One particularly meaningful hymn is "Wake, Awake, for Night is Flying". I especially appreciate the stanza which talks about our joy at Christ's presence:

Now let all the heav'ns adore you, And saints and angels sing before you.

The harps and cymbals all unite. Of one pearl each shining portal,

Where, dwelling with the choir immortal, We gather round your dazzling light.

No eye has seen, no ear Has yet been trained to hear.

What joy is ours! Crescendos rise; your halls resound; Hosannas blend in cosmic sound.

Do we, as Christians, truly appreciate "what joy is ours!"? As we approach Christmas, we often get warm and fuzzy feelings as we think about the birth of the baby of Bethlehem. But do we experience joy—true joy, because Christ comes to us, is born in us every Sunday? The gift of the incarnation of Jesus Christ is not an event to be celebrated but once a year on December 25 th —Christ becomes incarnate in flesh and blood—for us, each and every Sunday as His Word is proclaimed and the bread and wine of the Lord's Supper become His real presence among us. That's why we gather in the sanctuary each Sunday, surrounded by saints and angels-the choir immortal, gathering round His dazzling light with crescendos rising, His hall resounding as hosannas blend in cosmic sound! This is what Christian worship is—and why we gather faithfully each Sunday to receive the Christ who comes to us—in Word and Sacrament. This is why St. Paul encourages us not to neglect to meet together on the Lord's Day, as is the habit of some (Hebrews 10:25).

As we prepare to celebrate the Nativity of our Lord at Christmas, we claim the joy that is ours as we meet together and celebrate His coming to us in the means of grace each and every Sunday. It is the Lord's Day—we gather round His dazzling light with the choir immortal—our hosannas blending with

theirs in cosmic sound! It has been a blessing to work together with worship and music leaders at Grace, planning for Advent and Christmas services! Please have our special Advent and Christmas services on your calendar and consider inviting family, friends and neighbors to worship with us! Christmas is a time when those who are unchurched, unaffiliated and/or unbelievers are most open to an invitation to Christmas worship, where they may experience the Light of Christ in the midst of this sometimes dark and joyless world!

Advent III, December 17th: 8:30 AM Service of Word and Sacrament. 11 AM Service of Word and Sacrament with Christmas Pageant, "Prophets Foretold It" as the message!

**2023 Advent IV, December 24th 10 AM:** With Christmas Eve falling on Sunday, we will observe the Fourth Sunday in Advent with a special Advent Service of the Word with Lessons and Advent Carols! We will complete our lighting of the Advent wreath with the fourth candle and join together in a series of scriptural prophecies, related Advent hymn verses, sermon and Advent Litany of Preparation. Although we will celebrate the birth of our Savior at our evening services on Christmas Eve, we will bring Advent to a close with this meaningful service of hope and expectation!

Christmas Eve, December 24th 5 PM: The Nativity

of our Lord Children's/Family Christmas Service will be a somewhat simplified Holy Communion liturgy with candle-light and carols! We will light candles singing Silent Night, as the Christmas Gospel is read, proclaiming the birth of Jesus, the Light of the world! Children will be led to another room to hear and see a wonderful age-appropriate Christmas book proclaiming the good news of

Jesus' birth, '<u>Twas the Night</u>, by William Dean, illustrated by Sarah Lowe. At the same time, Pastor Wendel will preach the Christmas sermon in the sanctuary. After sermon and story, children will return as the service continues with the liturgy of the Lord's Supper. Our worship will be heightened by special music and singing!

Christmas Eve, December 24th, 8 PM: The Nativity of our Lord will be celebrated with a festive service of Word and Sacrament with music, singing, carols and Holy Communion. The service will begin with a chanted Proclamation of the Birth of Christ, from an ancient martyrology and we will worship using Setting 1 of the Lutheran Book of Worship. We will light candles during the singing of Silent Night, as the Christmas Gospel is read, proclaiming the birth of Jesus, the Light of the world! Pastor Wendel will preach the Christmas sermon titled, <a href="Dark Christmas">Dark Christmas</a> and the Light of Christ! As always, we will be blessed by special music and singing!

Christmas Day, December 25th, 10 AM: We will gather on Christmas Day to celebrate the Word made flesh to dwell among us! As Christmas Eve finds us gathered around the stable and manger, witnessing the baby born in Bethlehem, Christmas morning focuses our attention on the meaning of the Incarnation—that God became human in Jesus Christ, for us and for our salvation! Again, we will worship using LBW Setting 1, with lots of carols and Holy Communion!

- For the month of October, receipts exceeded expenses by 6,416. For the year, expenses exceeded receipts by \$18,671.

**Confidentiality is a priority** for intercessors. That means we do not discuss any of our prayers with anyone – not even other prayer team members.


There are 2 ways to ask for prayers:







### **Martin Luther's Younger Life**

Martin Luther is a complex figure. That his life and its significance are open to interpretation is shown by the fact that books upon books have been written about his life. This does not mean that all interpretations of his life and work are equally valid. Rather, it demonstrates that he played an important role in history, even among non-Lutherans. Protestants of various shades, even though they might disagree with him about a number of issues, still consider themselves a part of his legacy. Today, even many Roman Catholics have a renewed appreciation for him.

Luther was born on November 10, 1483 in Eisleben, Germany. At the time, there was no such thing as a unified country of Germany like today. Back then, what we now call Germany consisted of many little "Germanies," independent states and cities ruled by princes and city councils.

Infant mortality rates were very high back then, and so his parents took him to the local church the very next day, November 11, for baptism. Because that day was set aside to commemorate St. Martin of Tours, their son was named Martin. His father and mother were Hans and Margaretta Luder, which was later changed to "Luther." Hans was a copper miner. He wanted his son to have other opportunities, so he saved money for his education.

At the age of four, Martin was sent to boarding school in Mansfeld to learn Latin, the academic language of the day. Discipline was harsh, and if a student failed to memorize the Latin grammar for the day, he was often beaten. Luther did well, however, and he continued his education in Magdeburg and Eisenach. He then went to the University of Erfurt to obtain his law degree.

But the legend says that in 1505, Luther was returning home from Erfurt when he ran into a thunderstorm. The storm was so severe that he feared for his life. Having received harsh discipline from others as a child, he feared the wrath of God and doubted his salvation. He vowed to St. Anne, the patron saint of miners, that he would become a monk if allowed to live. Luther survived the storm, and keeping his word, he entered the Augustinian monastery in Erfurt.

In reality, it is possible that this "thunderstorm event" never actually happened. The story bears resemblance to the story of St. Paul in the book of Acts in the Bible (Acts 9:1-19). Jesus appeared to Paul on the road and changed his life. It is possible that Luther or someone close to him invented the story of Luther on the road from Erfurt as a way of dramatizing his life, making it parallel to a biblical story.

Regardless, Luther did enter the Augustinian monastery, much to his father's disappointment. Having saved money for Luther to become a lawyer with status, Luther chose to become a lowly monk. Like his other endeavors, Luther excelled at his religious vocation. He carefully observed the required fasting, praying, self-denial, and confession (penance). The way people were taught to think of salvation in that time was by the metaphor of a staircase. Sin brings you down on the staircase, and good works bring you up on the staircase to heaven. If your good works

outweighed your sins, you would achieve salvation. Luther once remarked, "If ever a monk could have reached heaven by monkery, then it was I." But Luther never felt that he had attained the level of righteousness that God demanded of him.

In 1507, Luther was ordained as a priest. He celebrated his first mass

with much fear and trembling. In 1510, he was selected by his father superior, Johann Staupitz, as an official representative to visit the holy city of Rome, the center of the medieval Western Church. There were many relics in Rome, which were said to possess special powers of holiness for pilgrims. But Luther was appalled by the lack of morality shown in Rome, even among other priests. He was told at one point that if he climbed the Holy Stairs (said to be the stairs to the palace of Pontius Pilate in the Bible), saying the Lord's Prayer with every step and kissing each step to the top, he would be granted pardon and a reduction of time in purgatory upon his death. But Luther never did find peace with God while in Rome. He returned to Germany in spiritual despair. We will continue next month with the beginning of Luther's work of reform of the Church.
