The processional Gospel, John 12:12-19 is read.

<sup>12</sup>The next day the large crowd that had come to the feast heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem. <sup>13</sup>So they took branches of palm trees and went out to meet him, crying out, "Hosanna! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord, even the King of Israel!" <sup>14</sup>And Jesus found a young donkey and sat on it, just as it is written, <sup>15</sup>"Fear not, daughter of Zion; behold, your king is coming, sitting on a donkey's colt!" <sup>16</sup>His disciples did not understand these things at first, but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things had been written about him and had been done to him. <sup>17</sup>The crowd that had been with him when he called Lazarus out of the tomb and raised him from the dead continued to bear witness. <sup>18</sup>The reason why the crowd went to meet him was that they heard he had done this sign. <sup>19</sup>So the Pharisees said to one another, "You see that you are gaining nothing. Look, the world has gone after him."

The minister begins the thanksgiving. The members of the congregation raise their branches.

#### **SECOND READING: Philippians 2:5-11**

St. Paul quoted a hymn that would have been well-known to the Philippian congregation, saying that Jesus humbled himself in his earthly life, taking on the form of a servant. His servanthood and obedience led him to death on the cross.

<sup>5</sup>Have this mind among yourselves, which is yours in Christ Jesus, <sup>6</sup>who, though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, <sup>7</sup>but emptied himself, by taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men. <sup>8</sup>And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross. <sup>9</sup>Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, <sup>10</sup>so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, <sup>11</sup>and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

(Gluten-free hosts are available by telling the person giving the host.)


#### Private prayer before receiving Holy Communion:

This session began on February 11<sup>th</sup>. This class meets in fellowship hall between services beginning at 9:45 and is facilitated by Bill Kulju.



#### **MUSIC NOTES**

#### "Partita on All Glory, Laud, and Honor" - Michael Burkhardt

The original Latin text by St. Theodulph of Orleans (750-821) is thought to have been written while he was in prison at Angers about 820 or 821. From the tradition that, when King Louis the Pious passed the prison, he heard Theodulph sing the hymn and afterward set him free – the hymn has often been used in Palm Sunday processionals. The original Latin consisted of 78 lines which was shortened and translated from the Latin by John Mason Neale (1818-1866). Neale's translation appeared in *Hymns Ancient and Modern* (1861). Its first printing was in the *Hymnal Noted* (1854) with the first line "Glory, and laud, and honor."

#### "Blessed Is He Who Cometh" - arr. Charles Gounod

Charles Gounod (1818-1893) was a French Composer who wrote twelve operas, of which Faust (1859) is the most popular, and a large amount of church music and other popular short pieces and songs including his Ave Maria (an elaboration of a Bach piece) and "Funeral March of a Marionette." "Blessed Is He Who Cometh" is from Gounod's "Communion Service" adapted from the "Messe Solennelle".

#### "O Come and Mourn with Me Awhile" - arr. Lani Smith

This hymn by F. W. Faber was first published in his *Jesus* and *Mary* (1849) in 12 stanzas of 4 lines and headed "Jesus Crucified," and again, after revision, in his *Hymns* (1862). It was brought into special notice by being included in an abbreviated and altered form in *Hymns Ancient and Modern* (1861). The original refrain reads, "Jesus, our Love, is crucified." This was changed in *Hymns Ancient and Modern* to "Jesus, our Lord, is crucified."

#### "Choral Postlude on Go to Dark Gethsemane" - arr. Robert Graham

The text for this hymn by James Montgomery (1771-1854) portrays four of the final incidents in the life of Jesus – His agony in Gethsemane, trial, crucifixion, and resurrection – and draws lessons for Christian living. First published in 1822, the present text is the second and much-revised form which

appeared in Montgomery's *Christian Psalmist* (1825) under the heading "Christ, our example in suffering."

#### YOU ARE INVITED...









...to our upcoming Holy Week services, especially those marking the Holy Triduum, or Holy Three Days which include Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday!

Maundy Thursday, March 28 (12:15 PM and 7 PM services) comes from the Latin word, mandatum or "command," marking the Lord's command to "Do this for the remembrance of me," with His institution of the Lord's Supper, as well as His command for His disciples to "love one another as I have loved you," illustrated by His washing of feet, but also the command for disciples to forgive as we've been forgiven! A 12:15 PM spoken service will be offered for those who prefer, with full service with music and singing at 7 PM.

Good Friday, March 29 (12:15 PM and 7 PM services) will focus on a service of Tenebrae (Shadows) as the church is progressively darkened with prayers and readings marking the Biblical Way of the Cross, beginning with Jesus in agony in the Garden of Gethsemane, ending with Jesus' burial and the sealing of the tomb, at which point a single candle remains lighted and is carried from the sanctuary, symbolizing the earth in darkness as the Lord is no longer alive in the world. The candle is returned to the sanctuary after a time, reminding worshipers that death isn't the last word, but that the Light of Christ isn't extinguished but will shine on Easter morning!

Easter Sunday, March 31 (8:15 AM and 11 AM services) We will celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord with a festive service of Word and Sacrament, with brass ensemble and choir! During the sermon time at both services, younger children who wish may depart the sanctuary for an age-appropriate story, "Twas the Morning of Easter!"

An Easter breakfast is served 9:30-10:45 AM.
